

1. Police/City officials:
  - Public commitment to reaching out to youth encouraging and educating positive interactions.
  - Police investment in developing relationships with young people in the communities they serve.

  - Train leaders in all neighborhoods, races, genders, abilities, etc, etc to confront issues deeply.
  - Convene summit of activists, nonprofits, agencies, etc to develop city advisory council that will address issues of power and privilege. Give them some kind of investigative powers.
  - Revise grand jury processes.
  - Implement REAL restorative justice throughout judicial system that will address systemic issues.
